













# THE HALACHOS OF SUKKOS ITEMS AND THEIR PROPER DISPOSAL

ITEM	ON SUKKOS	AFTER SUKKOS I (PREFERABLE)	AFTER SUKKOS II	COMMENTS
 <p>Arba Minnim</p>	Cannot be used for any other purpose.	Put in a place that won't be trampled. Some save and burn with the chametz.	Wrap well and put on the side of the garbage.	This category includes Lulavim, Hadassim, Lulav Rings and Koishiklach (leave holder of lulav).
 <p>Esrog</p>	Cannot be used for any other purpose. When not performing the mitzvah it may be smelled after making the proper bracha. Many avoid smelling altogether.	Put in a place that won't be trampled. Some make into a jelly to eat on Tu B'Shvat. (See Comments)	Wrap well and put on the side of the garbage.	If one bought an Esrog from Eretz Yisroel this year, it has Kedushas Sheviis. A Rav should be consulted about how to properly dispose of the Esrog or to learn how to make it into jelly in a halachically acceptable way.
 <p>Esrog Box</p>	No Kedusha	It may be put in a bag and thrown away.		This includes the foam or flax wrapping. If the box has a pasuk on it, it may need to be put in genizah.
 <p>Lulav Holder</p>	No Kedusha	It may be put in a bag and thrown away.		
 <p>Aravos/ Hoshanos</p>	Cannot be used for any other purpose.	Put in a place that won't be trampled. Some save and burn with the chametz.	Wrap and put on the side of the garbage.	Should not be intentionally smelled on Sukkos.
 <p>Decorations</p>	Do not use for other purposes unless this was stipulated before Sukkos.	They may be thrown away.		
 <p>Nails and Screws</p>	Do not use in a way that destroys their function as part of the sukkah.	They may be thrown away.		Only applicable when part of the sukkah.
 <p>S'chach</p>	Do not use in a way that destroys its ability to function as part of the sukkah.	Dispose of in a place that won't be trampled.	Burn it or bag it well and put on the side of the garbage.	
 <p>Sukkah Floor</p>	Do not use in a way that destroys its ability to function as part of the sukkah.			Only applicable when designated for the sukkah.
 <p>Sukkah Walls</p>	Do not use in a way that destroys their ability to function as part of the sukkah. i.e. - leaning is OK, pulling off a splinter is not.	Dispose of in a place that won't be trampled.	They should be burned.	If the sukkah stands all year round, it only has kedusha on Sukkos.
