Sunday (Seder Olam)

4. Did the Shechina rest in the Mishkon during the seven days of Miluim?

5. When did the Shechina rest in the Mishkon for the first time?

Rosh Chodesh Nissan (Ch. 9:23)

6. What blessing did Aharon give the Jews on that historic day?

Birchas Kohanim (Ch. 9:22)

7. What blessing did Moshe and Aharon give the Jews on that historic day?

May it be Hashem's will that the Shechina rest upon the work of your hands (Ch. 9:23)

8. Why was Aharon commanded to take a young calf as a sin offering?

Hashem granted him forgiveness by means of this calf for making the Golden Calf (Ch. 9:2)

9. What are the names of Aharon's sons?

Nadav, Avihu, Elazar, and Isamar

10. Can you name three offenses committed by Nadav and Avihu which made them guilty to die by fire?

1. They offered incense with unauthorized fire

2. They gave decisions in the presence of their Rebbi, Moshe Rabbeinu

3. They entered the Mishkon intoxicated with wine (Ch. 10:2)

11. Why does Hashem become feared and praised when He does judgement upon the Tzaddikim?

People say, "If Hashem punishes the Tzaddikim, how much more so will He punish the wicked!" (Ch. 10:3)

12. Why did Aharon suffer the loss of two sons?

Because of the sin of the Golden Calf (Ch. 10:12)

13. When his two sons died, what did Aharon say?

Nothing (Ch. 10:3)

14. What reward did Aharon receive for his silence?

Hashem commanded directly to him the next Parsha (Ch. 10:8-11) about Kohanim who are intoxicated with wine (Ch. 10:3)

15. If a Kohen did the Avodah while he was intoxicated, is it acceptable?

16. May a Kohen do the Avodah with torn clothes?

No (Ch. 10:6)

17. May a Kohen let his hair grow long?

No (Ch. 10:6)

18. How many goats for sin offerings were offered on that historic Rosh Chodesh Nissan?

Three (Ch. 10:16)

19. What was the occasion for each one of these sin offerings?

1. For the installation ceremony

2. Nachshon brought it as a free-will offering for the dedication of the Mizbeach

3. In honor of Rosh Chodesh

20. How did the Jews know exactly what things they may eat or may not eat?

Hashem showed the animals, birds, insects, reptiles, fish, etc. to Moshe, who showed them to the Jews.

21. What are the signs (simanim) of a kosher animal?

1. Cloven feet, which are divided above and below into two toes

2. Chews his cud, i.e., brings up the food from the stomach and returns it into its mouth to grind it thin (Ch. 11:3)

22. What are the signs (simanim) of a kosher fish?

1. Fins (fish swim with them)

2. Scales attached to them (Ch. 11:9)

23. If a fish sheds its signs while in the water, may one still eat it?

Yes (Ch. 11:12)
