And I shall harden בְּרֵעֹה s heart ... And he will not listen to you ... And I shall take out My legions, My people בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל, from the land of Egypt..." (שְׁמִוֹת זִי גִּי,דִי)

Why was it necessary to harden פֶּרְעֹה seart? What would have been different if פַּרְעֹה would have allowed the Jews to leave? R' Chaim Friedlander איי explains: Had פֵּרְעֹה listened to מֹשֶׁה's demand that בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל be released from Egypt, we might be grateful in some manner to הקבייה. פֵּרְעֹה to be thankful to anyone but Him. Consequently, He created a situation where it was obvious that only הקבייה — without any "assistance" — took us out of מצרים.

The מִּדְרָשׁ teaches us the extent to which we must recognize our benefactor so that we can feel gratitude towards that person. מֹשָׁה killed a מְבִּינוּ who was striking a Jew. When this became known, awas forced to flee the country, fearing for his life, and he came to מִּשָּה. One day, as יִּתְּרוֹ s daughters were pushed away by the local shepherds, מֹשְׁה stepped in and dispersed the would-be attackers. When the girls came home, they told יְּתָרוֹ that an אֵישׁ מִשְּׁה had rescued them. The simple explanation is that מֹשֶׁה was dressed like a מִצְּרִי so they thought that it was a מִצְרִי who had intervened on their behalf.

The מְדְרָשׁ interprets the words differently by first citing a

תְּשֶׁר. A man is bitten by a wasp and runs to the river to cool off the stinging bite. Arriving at the river, he sees a child drowning and jumps in to save him. The child tells the man, "If not for you, I would have drowned." The man replies, "If not for the wasp, I would not have been here to save you." When יְּתִירוֹ daughters thanked מֹשֶׁר that I killed. If not for him, I would not be here today." Thus, when יְּתִרוֹ daughters spoke of a מִצְרִי having saved them, they were referring to the מִצְרִי had killed. The words of יִתְרוֹ daughters can be interpreted as, "a מִצְרִי rescued us" — the מִצְרִי who caused הַצְרִי running away saved them.

There are many מְצְוֹת that are based on the concept of הַכָּרַת. Perhaps the most well known is the מִּצְוָה of מְצְוָה, the reading of the מָצְוָה.

משַׁרַשֵּׁי הַמִּצְוַה

The תְּנּוּלְיִם explains that the purpose of **reading** the four בְּכּוּרְים of פְּרָשָׁה in the grafitude is stronger when we say with words that we are feeling in our hearts. The תְּנוּךְ continues and explains that the stronger the feeling of gratitude, the greater will be the new בְּרָכָה that we will receive from יד. In His kindness, יד rewarded us with this תְּצְוָה (to express our feelings) so that we will merit to receive additional בְּרָכָה מִצְּוָה) תְּפִּוּרְה יִשְׁרִים סֹף מִצְּוָה (כֹא Adapted from: מַבְּרַיִּם אוֹנִים בּיִרְיִם הַשְּבֵּוּע – נארא).



The Soloist's Sacrifice



The רַמְבַּ״ן points out that there are only three cases where the תורה mentions the wives of the leaders; each time, the reason is to teach us that the offspring of these great people descended not only from eminent fathers, but from distinguished mothers as well. עַמְרָם married אַהְרֹעָ married אֵלִישֶׁבַע sister of נְחְשׁוֹן, from the royal tribe of יְהוּדָה, who later became the most distinguished of the אֲהָרֹן .נְשִׂיאִים and אֱלִישֶּׁבַע became the forebears of the פַּנְחָס whose son פַּנְחָס became the only one who was granted priesthood as a result of his own merit, married a daughter of פוטיאַל, a name that, the Sages teach, refers to both יוֹתֶרוֹ and יִתָּרוֹ.

The young Schiff girl had been blessed with a beatutiful voice and great talent. But for a religious girl in Vienna, Austria, in the early 1900s, coming from a traditional תּוֹרָה home, professional singing was not an option.

One day, a famous agent offered the girl a lucrative opportunity. Thrilled, she discussed the matter with her parents. When the Schiffs heard about the agent's offer to their daughter, they knew that they could not allow her to accept it. The girl refused to listen. Her father brought her to the בַּ, R' Shlomo Baumgarten צַייל, who tried to convince her to abandon this choice of career. Sensing that she was not swayed, the בן suggested that they visit R' Yitzchak Meir Heschel צַצִּייל, the Kapishnitzer Rebbe, who was in Vienna at the time. Immediately, father and daughter set out to visit the רָבִי.

As soon as they arrived, the frantic father poured out his heart. The בְּבִי then spoke to the girl. "Tell me, מַיַן טײַערע יִיִּדִישׁע טאַכטער, my dear Jewish daughter, why do you want so badly to go into this field?"

The girl answered honestly, "It is because of the fame that I will have. I'll be known throughout the world."

The רָבִי closed his eyes, deep in thought, contemplating the sentiments the girl had just expressed. After a moment or two, he opened his eyes and began to speak.

"Listen closely, my dear daughter. It is the dream of every young Jewish woman to be blessed with a child who will illuminate the world through his תורה learning. I promise that if you now sacrifice your chance at fame, there will come a time when you will be blessed with a child whose תורה will light up the world. He will become the פוסק הדור, one of the greatest halachic authorities of his time. Your fame will come — but it will be through him."

The young Schiff girl wiped away her tears and thought deeply about the magnanimous promise the בָּבי had just made. She was a fine, young Jewish girl — and so, after considering the offer, she accepted.

R' Dan Segal וַצִּייל found this amazing episode in the סֶבֶּר of Austria and decided to pursue the rest of the story. He discovered that this girl eventually married and had a son by the name of שמואל. He was R' Shmuel HaLevi Wosner אָב בּית דִין, the אָב בּית דִין, the אָב בּית דִין of פֵּגֵי בַּרָק, the author of the שָׁבֵּט הָלָנִי, and one of the outstanding halachic authorities of our time.

When R' Dan approached R' Wosner to ask him if the story was true, he became quite emotional and with tears in his eyes replied, "It all makes sense now ... when I was younger, my mother always encouraged me to learn well and be an ehrliche Yid. She always said, 'You cannot imagine what I sacrificed for you.'"

This beautiful story is just one example of the sacrifices a Jewish mother makes for her children. It is impossible for children to fully appreciate this מְּשִירָת נָפֵשׁ — but all children, no matter what their age, should always strive to do their best in order to make their mothers' sacrifices worthwhile.

R' Pinchus Hirschprung זַצִּייל, Chief Rabbi of Montreal, was not only known for his brilliant mind, but also for his sensitive heart that was always open to help a fellow Jew in trouble. There were times when he was only able to accomplish his remarkable acts of מסד by fusing both of these מַעַלוֹת, special attributes, together.

Once, a ייִד in Montreal was in need of assistance from the Polish government. Although the Polish Consulate General was in Montreal, since the issue was sensitive, the best solution was having a face-to-face meeting with the Polish ambassador in the Embassy (stationed in Ottawa, over a 2-hour journey from Montreal). The man asked that R' Pinchus

accompany him and testify on his behalf. The קב graciously agreed to travel the 125-mile trip to help his fellow Jew.

The T" picked up R' Hirschprung at the appointed time. While en route, the appointed time. skimmed through all the documents the man had put together. One "non-important" item in the car was a Polish book written by this same ambassador. Being fluent in Polish, R' Hirschprung glanced through the book rapidly. When thev entered the ambassador's office, he began to recite the entire message of the book to the amazed diplomat. The ambassador smiled. Hirschprung had spoken about a topic that warmed his heart. He spread his arms wide and said, "Rabbi, anything I can do for you, I will."

My תַּלְמִיד, R' Hirschprung was already doing a great קסד just by accompanying this Jew on a long journey which took many hours of his time. He was a מֶתְמִיד and מַתְמִיד who spent every moment of his time in תורה learning. He surely could have spent his precious time in the car occupied in learning. Instead, he extended his חֵסֶד by using his genius to digest the contents of a diplomat's book that he hoped could help in his חֶסֶד mission. תּוֹרָה study is the greatest מְצְוָה of all, but there is a time for מֶּצְוָה. The בַ taught us one must perform that תְּסֶד using the same כוחות as one uses for learning חורה.


